The General Assembly of the European Union of Rechtspfleger decides the following

R e s o l u t i o n :

- I: The European Union of Rechtspfleger requests all Ministers of Justice of the European states, to create the common legal career profile of a European Rechtspfleger on the basis of the Green Paper for a European Rechtspfleger (to be found on: www.eu-rechtspfleger.eu).
- II. The European Union of Rechtspfleger requests the European Commission, to work out a green paper for the introduction of the European Rechtspfleger on the basis of the recommendation of the E.U.R. and to begin a scientific discussion in the European space.
- III. Finally the introduction of the European Rechtspfleger shall be realised with a green paper and a white paper as a step to a regulation of the European Union.

The citizens of Europe have the right on a common area of law, in which fast and qualitatively good jurisdiction must be ensured by a justice, which is efficient and close to the citizens. The overloading of the courts contributes to the fact that the citizens, who are looking for their rights, have to wait too long for their decisions. In order to discharge the judges a common legal career profile of the European Rechtspfleger (Bachelor of Law) is to be created for the range of the non-contentious jurisdiction (no lawsuits).

The common legal training is to be introduced according to the Bologna process for Bachelor of Law and Master of Law.

Already now judicial tasks should be transferred for the first time or further more. At once judicial tasks can be transferred to equivalent court officers.

This causes a justice in a common area of law within the European Union, which is efficient and close to the citizens.

The General Assembly
